Final Update on Pool & Lagoon Projects

It has been such a blessing to be part of the Hidden Acres family and experience the last two fundraising seasons. In 2024, we finished the Chris Clark Airnasium, and our staff has been able to step back and watch God use that space in awesome ways. This year we are raising funds for two important and necessary infrastructure projects: the indoor swimming pool renovation and the expansion of our sewer lagoon. The rest of this article provides an update on these projects and where we stand with fundraising efforts.

Indoor Pool

The pool remodel is completed and paid in full, and the area is once again open for guests to enjoy! We want to extend a special thanks to Jered Peterson from Evolution Pools who helped us plan and manage this project.

The pool project was divided into two parts. First, we completely replaced the pool deck flooring. The old stamped concrete floor was lifting and chipping; it wasn't safe and wouldn't pass the next inspection. We now have a beautiful, brand-new flaked polyurea floor with new drains! The new surface is a beautiful dark grey hue and includes additives to make it slip-resistant. We are pleased with the look and feel of the new surface.

The other half of this project involved replacing outdated equipment in the pool's pump room. Maintenance costs were getting high as this equipment aged, so we're excited to have a completely new system in place. We gutted the equipment room and installed white PVC board walls and LED lights. We then installed a new state-of-the-art system with new plumbing and a UV component. The UV technology kills bacteria as water runs through the piping. This new system will restore pool chemical levels much quicker after heavy use.

We also repaired our underwater LED lights inside the swimming pool, added a portable handicap lift, and purchased a robot pool vacuum affectionately named Wally by our housekeeping team.

Sewer Lagoon

The planning stage of the sewer lagoon project was lengthy. After months of work with the lowa DNR and Snyder Engineering, we received approval to proceed with this project in January. Vanderpool Construction won the bid for this project and arrived at the beginning of April to start digging and moving dirt. They have been awesome to work with!

I really didn't understand how much was involved in digging a big hole in the ground! There's so much engineering and tons of dirt to move, and I can now see just how massive the 4.8 acre lagoon is in comparison to the old 1-acre lagoon. Vanderpool has already removed the topsoil and will spread it out after digging is complete; this will foster vegetation regrowth in the area.

The project is about 1/3 complete to date. Crews are working daily and are staying at Hidden Acres overnight to save on travel costs. Once the lagoon is completely dug out, piping crews will arrive to hook it into our existing infrastructure. The final step of this project is an inspection. Everything should be finished by the end of May, just in time for our summer camp season!

Summer Camp News

Summer Camp starts in about six weeks! We're excited to learn about this summer's theme, WILDERNESS.

Current summer staff numbers are strong. We have contracted 187 high school and college students to fill counseling and specialist roles. That's our largest summer staff ever!

In late March we invited all summer staff to a training weekend and 135 attended. The purpose of the retreat was two-fold: to instruct staff how to study and teach our curriculum and to start building relationships. Pastor Damian Peasley from Madrid EFC taught the Pathways Bible Study method to the summer staff, and the

weekend was full of fellowship between new and returning staff.

We currently have 2,966 summer camp registrations, which is 143 ahead of this time last year. If you haven't signed your children up for camp yet, do so as soon as possible!
