Hidden Acres has never had a development or advancement team, and in the past we've relied on retreat income and generous donors to keep our camp running full-speed. However, as the camp continues to grow, our leadership knew we needed to devote more time and resources to developing new donor relationships and increasing fundraising. Our weekly directors' meetings have addressed this topic several times over the past year.

Once we knew we needed to devote more resources to "camp advancement," the next focus was finding the right person or group of people to lead our advancement team. I prayed over this need and spoke to our board members, especially Chris Clark, a long-time friend of Hidden Acres. They provided good counsel and we began looking for the right advancement team.

The Airnasium Project & Fundraiser

Thank you for coming to camp as our guest over the years! Hidden Acres has always been a special place for our own family, and we have been very blessed by the summer camp and retreat ministry. We now have a new opportunity to bless future guests. You may have heard of our plan to construct a canopy over the outdoor basketball court, which is called an "airnasium." The outdoor basketball court is the concrete pad just south of the Family Life Center. We have had a string of hot summers, and airnasiums are common in warmer southern U.S. states to combat heat and intense sunlight. We honestly see an airnasium as a unique way to expand the ministry of Hidden Acres more than just providing shade against the hot sun.

Hidden Acres now has over 20,000 annual guests along

with 3,700 summer campers (K-12 students). Our ability to care for and extend hospitality to that many guests has become more of a challenge when large groups desire to use camp. While we have used the basketball court as our outdoor chapel for worship and teaching time, Hidden Acres has growing events like our Men's Retreat, Sportsmen's Retreat, and Family Camp where the extreme heat or cold makes using an outdoor space tough. We now also have churches, colleges, and youth ministry groups that want to bring large groups of 700-900 guests at one time. While that is an awesome opportunity, we simply do not have adequate facilities to allow larger groups to be together in one place for worship and teaching time. However, never fear, the Lord has impressed upon our hearts a solution: an airnasium at camp! (Continued on p. 2)

The Airnasium Project (Continued)

Throughout this letter are photos of the anticipated Airnasium over the existing basketball court. Phase one of the project is to construct the shell of the building, including one solid wall, three open walls, and large garagestyle doors that will allow us to enclose the Airnasium. This flexible building style will allow us to provide a large gathering place or gym space in any season of the year. Phase two of the project will include interior finishes like utilities, sheetrock, seating, and a stage area. Overall, this structure falls right in line with the new mission statement of Hidden Acres as "A place set apart to encounter Jesus!"









Expected Costs:

- \$700,000 for exterior shell, insulation, and doors (\$300,000 has already been earmarked in our development fund – praise the Lord!)
- \$150,000 to finish the interior

Fundraising Goal: \$850,000
